U13 Girls

In the lead up to the trip to Malvern College for the MBD Festival, the girls participated in Winter training sessions in Castleknock College, 48 of the 89 girls nominated by their clubs attended these winter sessions. We reduced the squads as we went while also maintaining sessions for those not selected for the reduced squad. We also had an Easter Camp as well as a 2-day training clinic in July in Civil Service CC. After these we replaced the trial match with a new competition – the Fifty Ball League (FBL). We selected 4 district teams, like what you see in the boys district cup. We decided to align the competition with the new Cricket Leinster run Hundred Ball League (HBL). The offer was opened up to any girls playing cricket in the Leinster in the suitable years. An initial 26 girls showed interest.
